take up

take up

take forward

take aside

llevar aparte para hablar

separable · B1

- 1 The manager took me aside after the meeting.
- 2 She took the student aside to explain the feedback privately.

take in

alojar temporalmente

- 1 The family took two evacuees in.
- 2 The shelter takes in animals that need urgent care.

take to

empezar a gustar o adoptar

inseparable · B2

- 1 The children quickly took to their new teacher.
- 2 She took to working remotely almost immediately.

- 2 The reviewer took the argument apart point by point.

take out on

descargar una emoción sobre alguien

separable · B2

- 1 Do not take your frustration out on the team.
- 2 He apologized for taking his bad mood out on us.
